# Soccer team faces CM tonight

Last year the Broncos finished second behind San Diego State with a 9-2-1 record and will be out to take first place this year.

Coach Marks said "this years team will be using three forward line men instead of the usual four."

Two of the starting forwards will be Bernardo Bohrquez and Jeff Abrams a new player from Brazil.

Abrams has great speed and is a good ball handler with speed being his greatest asset.

Bohrquez is also a great ball handler with good speed. He is

always a threat to break away and score because of his speed and strong shooting.

Coach Marks said "the difference between this years team and last years is the offense. This years team is more balanced."

"There will be more passing and the scoring will be more spread out."

Don Le Roy will lead the Broncos defense this year, which has improved since last years loss to San Diego.

Coach Marks said "Saturday nights game should be evenly contested with the outcome depending on whose is the strongest defense."

With two minutes gone in the fourth quarter Joe Rivera, who played goalie for Cal Poly in the first half, and ten switched to forward, scored. The goal was unusual in that his teammate began the drive with a kick that hit off the overhead goal post, Rivera was in the right place for the carom and scored. The second goal was accredited to Cal Poly's Carl Theis. Actually he had only passed in front where a UCR player accidentally kicked it in.

Saturday's loss put the Highlanders season record at 3-9-1 overall, and 1-5 in league play. On Wednesday UCR plays Westmont at 2 p.m. The game will be played here.

## Broncos move to College Division

Cal Poly, Pomona has been granted College Division classification by the National Collegiate Athletic Association.

The Broncos' request to be switched from University to College Division becomes effective with the 1970-71 academic year.

The reclassification means Bronco teams and individual performers will compete in the College Division post-season playoffs and championship competition.

"The College Division provides our athletic program with a more equal opportunity for post-season competition," said Assistant Athletic Director Jerry Miles. "We are pleased that the NCAA's quick action on our request has made the reclassification effective this season."

He said the offense was good for the first ten minutes of the game but after that they went back to playing as individuals.

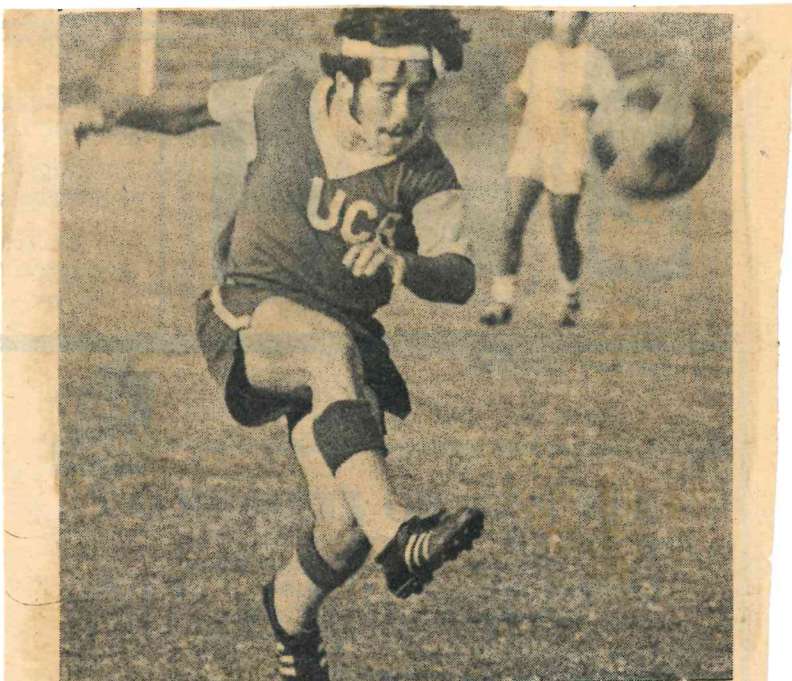
The soccer team's record is 5-5-1 overall and 3-3 in league this season.

UC San Diego is much improved over last year's team, he said, so it should be a good game to watch.

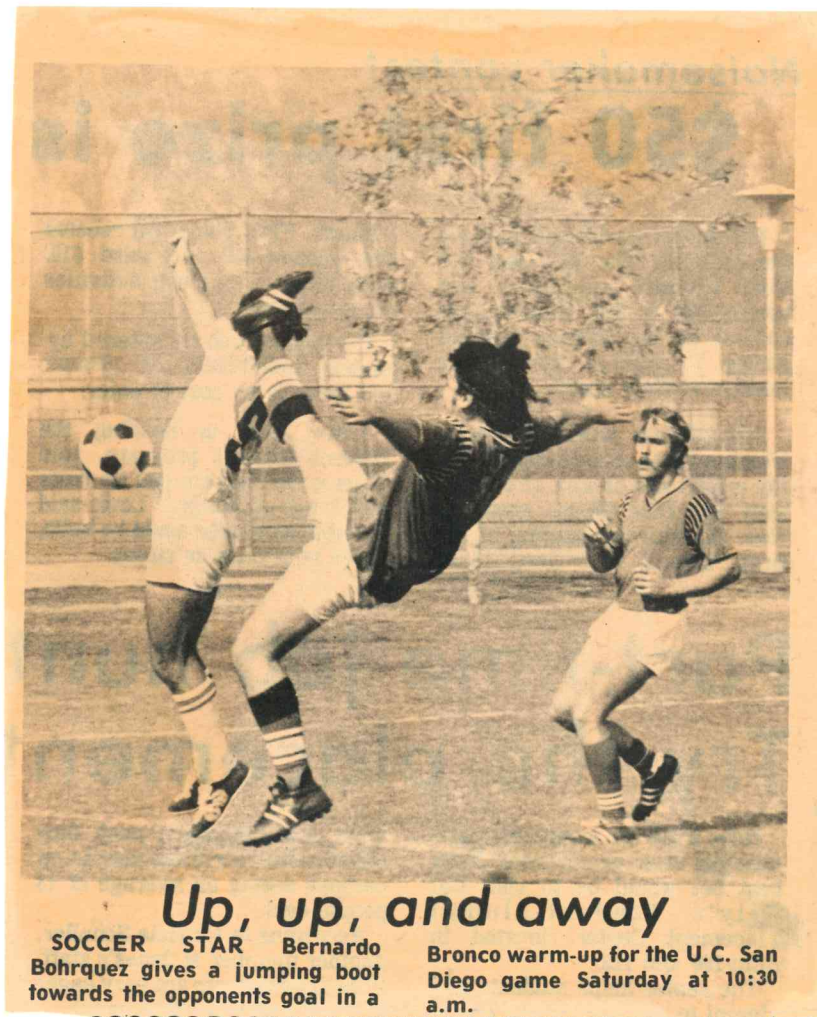

Cal Poly's Minor Sports weren't so minor this fall. The end of the 1970 found Cross water Polo, and Soccer posting very reputable records. In this reporter's opinion any sort of record from teams which lack enough funds to get players new jocks is a remarkable feat, but they managed to pull through. Even though there are a few events which are left to play, this is a good time to recap the events of the past season.

Cross country has a very young team this year, composed largely of freshmen and sophomores with a few juniors and seniors sprinkled in. This rookie team started off slow but ended in a hot race for the CCAA title. The first few tournaments—Long Beach and Las Vegas — proved disastrous as far as the team goes. but individuals such as Lium Ryan and Lynn Buello ran good races.
